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First edition of this scarce routier of the West Indies, attributed to John Cowley. Mathematician and Geographer of his Majesty (George II), Cowley's most famous work is "Counties of England" (1745).

He was a professor of mathematics at the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich, London, for a number of years between 1761 and 1773. He was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society in April, 1768.
