Unrecorded map showing the built and proposed lines of the Indian Branch Railway Company Ltd.

The Indian Branch Railway was founded in 1862, in order to build small branch and feeder lines in the north-east of the country, especially the mainline between Calcutta and Delhi. The two

completed lines - Azimganj and Nalhati (opened 1863) and Kanpur to Lucknow (opened 1867) - are marked with a solid red line. The proposed lines from Meerut to Buxar were not realised in the company's lifetime, with the business being merged with the Oudh and Rohilkhand Railway in 1872.
