A magnificent composite atlas with wonderful original rich colour heavily embellished in oil and gold.

Of note is the inclusion of Mortier's impressive chart of the Mediterranean, with its beautifully rendered floral garlands and the 38 vignettes of Mediterranean cities.

In addition to these, and the maps by Visscher are 27 by F. De Wit, 26 of J. Blaeu, 7 by J. Janssonius, three by C. Allard, two by H. Jaillot, and one each by G. Valck, G. Mercator, J. De Ram, J. Robyn, J. Van Loon, and J. B. Labanna.

The atlas includes two maps of the world: Visscher's own, and the wonderful planisphere "Unicum Olanisphaerium Totius Orbis Terrarum Completum" printed by H. Doncker after Luchtenburg; map of the North Pole; maps of Iceland; Russia; Scandinavia (4); Lithuania; Poland; Prussia; Germany; Lower Saxony; Brandenburg; Mecklenburg; Holstein; Bremen; Braunschweig; Saxony; Anhalt; Meissen; Thuringia; Bohemia; Austria; Carinthia; Bavaria (4); Franconia; Wuerttemberg; Switzerland (2); Basel; Zurich; Aargau; Trent; Alsace (3); Swabia; Rhineland-Palatinate; Rhine-Mosel-Area; Frankfurt; Lower Rhine; Trier; Nassau; Hesse; Westphalia; Paderborn; Kleve; Cologne; Holland and Belgium (31); Luxembourg (van der Vekene 3.01 a: engraved by G.
