Biography

Jean Baptiste Delure (c1660-1736) was an editor and publisher of prints and maps, as well as an engineer of mathematical and scientific instruments. He also manufactured globes, but only two are

recorded: the present celestial globe, and a terrestrial one of the same dimensions, produced in the same year. These were presumably designed as a pair.

Astronomy

Delure presents the cartography in French. The equator and ecliptic are both graduated and labelled. The constellations are depicted as mythical beasts and creatures. Below “L’hydre femelle” appears a magnitude table labelled “Grandeur et Figure des Etoilles”. The globe depicts 48 Ptolemaic constellations, as well as several non-Ptolemaic constellations.
